For registered nurses who have an ADN and a Bachelor's degree in a non-nursing program, there is an opportunity to obtain their MSN through what is called the RN to MSN Bridge Program. Hours are calculated as follows:

 $ADN = 30\ hours\ and\ all\ prerequisites\ for\ the\ BSN\ program.\ Bachelor's\ in\ another\ discipline = 90\ hours.$
