Please note: the Minor in Addiction Studies is **not** a minor program in Social Work. It is intended to provide students in helping disciplines, including social work, nursing, occupational therapy, education and psychology, with practical coursework in the field of addiction studies to fill a present need in the community.

The 18 credit hours required for the minor correspond with the 270 classroom hours necessary for CADC certification in Kentucky (per the 201 KAR 35:050 "Curriculum of Study" regulation, 1 academic credit hour = 15 classroom hours). Students choosing Social Justice Perspectives on HIV and AIDS (SW 385) as an elective satisfy all current content requirements. Classroom training represents only a portion of the CADC requirements and completion of the minor in no way ensures licensure.

Students must complete the following four required courses (12 credit hours). SW 330 and SW 420 will be offered annually by the School of Social Work. SW 410 and SW 435 are offered in alternating years.
