For registered nurses who have an ADN and a Bachelor's degree in a non-nursing program, there is an opportunity to obtain their MSN through what is called the RN to MSN Bridge Program. Hours are calculated as follows:

ADN = 30 hours and all prerequisites for the BSN program. Bachelor's in another discipline = 90 hours.

Two nursing specific courses that need to be taken at the Baccalaureate level must be completed at Spalding University in order to satisfy BSN requirements:

NURS 472: Population Centered Care 4 Credit hours

NURS 455: Healthcare Policy 3 Credit hours

Please note: Students enrolling in an RN to MSN Bridge track will not obtain a BSN degree or be eligible for a BSN stop out. The student must complete all MSN program requirements in order to receive the MSN credential.
